**SECOND SUNDAY ORDINARY TIME** *We are to use our everyday actions and conversations to help attract others to Jesus.*

Through their witness of Jesus as the Messiah, John the Baptist and Saint Andrew are instrumental to the world coming to know about Jesus and his mission on earth. By telling a friend or relative about Jesus, which is what these men did, we are continuing this work of evangelization today.

In today's first reading, Eli teaches Samuel how to respond to God's call. The second reading teaches that our bodies are to be used by us to glorify God. John the Baptist tells his followers that Jesus is the Messiah.

**AND STILL MORE** How would you like to be a rock star? Or a president with a face that everybody knows? Many celebrities admit that the fame they once sought has become a burden. Famous people can't go anywhere without the paparazzi following them. Just getting out of a car causes an eruption of flashing camera lights.

At the beginning of Jesus' ministry, John had to point him out to the complacent world: "Look, there is the Lamb of God." Today's Gospel describes the beginning of Jesus' fame. Soon he will have no place to hide, and the great crowds will follow him wherever he goes. Before today's Gospel passage ends, Andrew is already running to tell his brother Simon that he has found the Messiah.

When she was 8 years old she had her calling to a religious life at her confirmation. She met Mother Teresa in May 24, 1976. She was the first Candidate when Mother Teresa founded the Missionaries of Charity Contemplatives in South Bronx, NY. She assisted at the foundation in Washington DC, Brooklyn, NY and Chicago, IL. She was the Superior who founded the first Contemplative house outside the US, in Tijuana, Mexico. As well as, the first Contemplative houses in Santiago Cuba and Nairobi Kenya at the end of the Great Rwanda Genocide-which killed 800,000 people. In 2003, she came to the Society of Our Lady of the most Holy Trinity (SOLT). She served there rebuilding the original founding mission in Homan, New Mexico which was abandoned for nearly 40 years. Sister Marie Hased is here in Iowa building a retreat center called Domus Trinitatis, meaning home of the trinity. It is a retreat center for everyone to go and center themselves in Christ.
