The first reading from Sirach reminds us God has a special love for the weak and oppressed, the orphan and the widow. We must persevere in faith and keep our eyes fixed on heaven, as we hear in our second reading. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable about the Pharisee and the tax collector. Which one are we like?

When we approach the Lord in prayer, whether it be for help or strength, we should avoid false pretenses. Instead, we should recognize who we are — in our struggles and achievements — and stand before the Lord in honesty. This helps us recognize our need for God's grace and mercy, grow in our faith, and give a more faithful witness to the Gospel.

OCTOBER 2016: Using Your IRA to Contribute to Our Faith STO, Parish or Catholic School. If you are 70 ½ or older you are required to take a minimum distribution from your IRA, whether you need the income or not. If you are in this situation, you can gift up to \$100,000 of that required withdrawal to the Our Faith STO or any Catholic parish or school. This IRA distribution must be given directly to the STO, parish or school by the financial institution managing the IRA in order to qualify.
