SOMETHING MORE – *The dead man sat up and began to speak. At this point, the Gospel says, “Jesus gave the man back to his mother.” Was it awareness of his own coming death and of his widowed mother’s loss that moved Jesus to respond mercifully and dramatically to the loss and sorrow of his mother?*

In the second reading today, St. Paul tells of his journey to learn about Christ Jesus after he had spent many years of his life persecuting Jesus in his followers. Coming to accept Christ was a complete turnaround for Paul. Previously Paul would have been scandalized by Jesus’ conduct in this scene today. The converted Paul, however, would be ready to follow in Jesus’ footsteps in his encounters with the sorrowing people.

Right now you and I, too, are called by Christ to the widows and the hurting people of our day. We’ll see the needs and sorrow. We’ll reach out – even if others won’t understand or agree with our actions. We will bring life to loss and death. Jesus’ ministry of compassion and mercy will continue through us.

10th Sunday in Ordinary Time – *Focus: We give thanks to the Lord for the gift of life.*

Life itself is a precious gift from God. With that gift comes the obligation to use what we have been given for the betterment of ourselves and others. To waste the talents that are uniquely ours is a loss that can never be recovered. We can praise the Lord with who we are and what we are.

And Still More – Have you ever been awakened by someone calling your name? In a pleasant scenario, you might hear your name followed by “Dinner is ready.” Perhaps in a worst scenario, it is 4:45 a.m. on your first day of military boot camp, and your drill instructor is angrily telling you to “hit the deck!”

In scripture, Jesus calls across the chasm of death to the centurion’s servant; to the daughter of Jairus; to the widow’s son in Naim; and finally to Lazarus in Bethany. He called them by name. His own voice instructed them to rise. Scripture tells us that one day we too will hear the voice of Jesus calling us by name. He will invite us to rise to a new life in the realm of paradise.
